

## Empowering young people through legal capability: Ideas exchange summary

### Some of the ideas you gave us:

- Use youth media, websites, DVD's, community training events, television. Also think about sports, music and drama - other gateways to knowledge
- Schools need to do more, both PSE and Key stage 6 in particular, but also starting some basics at primary level. Specialist citizenship teams that are shared between schools could help build capacity.
- Outreach services should think about pupil referral units, prisons and outreach via advice services
- Delivery can involve volunteers; lawyers, retired teachers, young people and more. Per education works particularly well.
- The international dimensions are also important, human rights values are transnational and delivery can involve international organisations
- Commissioning of services should demonstrate clear evidence of engagement with young people in planning and delivery
- Build on strengths, expand university law school provision, and support established providers and infrastructure organisations.
- Target mental health, minority groups, migrants; PLE should be part of a range of services these groups receive.
- Government needs to pool its resources across different departments and improve liaison for a coherent strategy.
